

## **Council Member Al Filidoro**

### **Hard Working - Uniquely Qualified**

In 2007 the Flower Mound Town Council appointed Al Filidoro to fill the vacated seat left by the retiring Paul Stone in Place 2. The following year the voters affirmed Town Council's choice by electing Council Member Filidoro to an additional two year term. On May 8 Council Member Filidoro is once again seeking your support to continue to serve the residents of Flower Mound.

Council Member Filidoro brings to his Council position a wealth of legal, business and government experience. Prior to developing his law practice, Council Member Filidoro held a number of financial leadership positions in the private sector and government. As Director of Finance of the Ohio Lottery Commission he had fiscal responsibility for a \$1.5 billion state agency. His other government experience includes over ten years of state, local, and school auditing and financial analysis. Mr. Filidoro previously served on Flower Mound's Planning and Zoning Commission where he was elected as Chairman by his peers. His diverse career also includes private sector roles such as telecommunications management for GTE/Verizon and, of course, running his own small business, The Law Office of Albert Filidoro, Jr.

Mr. Filidoro is an Attorney at Law licensed by the Supreme Court of Texas and admitted to practice in front of the United States Supreme Court. He is also a member of the Flower Mound and Denton County Bar Associations and is an experienced mediator. His law office is located in Flower Mound. Mr. Filidoro not only enjoys practicing law, he enjoys teaching it. He serves as an Associate Professor of Graduate Studies at the University of Phoenix in Dallas and Los Colinas.

Despite the demands of his law practice and Town Council responsibilities, Council Member Filidoro still finds time to be give back to the community as the current President of the Summit Club, the oldest civic and social organization in Flower Mound. He is also an active member of Trietsch Memorial United Methodist Church in Flower Mound, where he serves as an usher on the Hospitality Team and plays drums with the Sunday 11:00 am worship orchestra.

Council Member Filidoro's other community involvement includes membership in the Flower Mound's Chamber of Commerce and Rotary Club. He also serves on the Flower Mound Community Development Corporation as well as other town boards.

He holds a J.D. from Texas Wesleyan University School of Law, an MBA from LeTourneau University, and a BBA from Cleveland State University.
